
In the previous Newsletter, I wrote about a painting by one of my favourite Danish painters, L.A. Ring. It was a depiction of the artist's wife, Sigrid, pregnant and standing in the threshold between their house and their lush summer garden. It was painted in 1897, just a year after their marriage.

In this Newsletter, I will write about another painting of L.A. Ring depicting his wife again, in the same room and with almost the same view of the garden, but it is painted the year after in 1898. The title is "Ved frokostbordet og morgenaviserne", in English "At breakfast with the morning papers". In the painting from the year before. the pregnant Sigrid was standing in the threshold. She was on the verge of something new in her life, something that was both tied closely to her very own being and at the same time totally foreign to her. Her new matrimonial status as well as her pregnancy was in this way symbolised in the theme of the threshold, a favourite theme of L.A. Ring. We who were enjoying the painting were wondering where Sigrid would go, inside or outside, or whether she would just stay in the threshold, bound by the dilemma of her double-sided situation. The painting from 1897 did not give us any answers, but invited us to reflect and gave us room to make our own judgment of her situation as of our own.

I see in L.A. Ring's open-ended inquisitive art, a true sign of his superior mastering his medium. I cannot help but see the parallel to the teachings of Jesus himself on earth.

Jesus never closed our minds and hearts with firm laws and demands that would stop us from thinking ourselves.

# A message from the Board

Happy summer! The Board and I miss you. We miss your smiling faces, your cheerful greetings and your warm handshakes and hugs. We hope that you are managing well during our new normal and that you have been able to enjoy the beautiful season despite all the changes and restrictions. I would ordinarily be writing about some of the wonderful church activities going on over the summer but during this year of cancellations, there have been no activities. One of our favourite summer activities, Camp Kuriakos, is but another cancelled item on the agenda of 2020 and is particularly missed.

We are heartened to be able to return to Services in the church. Attendance has been a bit low but in the circumstances it isn't unexpected. We are fully prepared to welcome you back - we have hand sanitizer and masks (for those without their own) at the entrance, and the pews are marked for physical distancing. All the pew backs, door handles and other high touch areas are disinfected prior to Service, and entry and exit plans are in place. Sadly, we cannot meet in the basement for coffee and fellowship either before or after Service. Pastor Lasse does a shortened version of our regular Service and is able to give communion to those wanting to partake. We are not permitted to sing hymns, only hum along, but Pastor Lasse has a splendid voice and he is allowed to sing providing he faces away from the congregation. All who are in good health are welcome and encouraged to come.

We've had one open air service at the Wildenhoff farm and another at the Kristensen farm. Both services, held in the beautiful nature and fresh country air, were in themselves a celebration of God's creation. It was wonderful to see those who came. Thank you for your hospitality Birgit & Erik, and Alice & Kris.

We have had to do some technical upgrading to boost our WiFi strength to better 'broadcast' the on-line Services. The second phase of the upgrade wasn't yet completed at the time of writing so I'll hope all is running smoothly by the time you are reading this. We've heard from many people that the on-line service is deeply appreciated by those unable to attend in person. A HUGE Thank You to all the people working so hard behind the scenes to bring this piece of God's word to the congregation.

The heavy rains early this summer brought to light a deficiency with the eavestroughs on the north side of the church and we've had to replace them to prevent flooding in the basement

It has been a struggle to adjust to the pandemic. We've all had to rearrange our lives, our plans, our ways of doing things, and many of us have had to shift our travel plans. Ansgar Church has seen a notable decrease in donations over the past few months. Our expenses are not significantly less. 



I see the parallel of L.A. Ring's genius to Jesus' teaching in how Jesus always did everything to open our minds and hearts to new possibilities and new perspectives in our often too settled and constrained life.

We, as Christians, must therefore think for ourselves and in this way, it is not easy to be a Christian. We cannot just believe and do whatever we are told. We must think along with Jesus and his compassionate word of love to us. We must make our own decisions in our unique life situation. We all know that nothing ever comes back the same in life. We can learn from history, from own experiences, and we should also be open to let us be inspired by the caring and loving word of God. But we must take our own stand in our own unique situation.

There is lots of inspiration to find in the word of Jesus Christ. We all know, let's say, the parable of the Good Samaritan. We hear in the story how the Good Samaritan is doing good to his fellow human being in need. We, of course, will never be in that exact same situation as the Samaritan, but the suggestion Jesus Christ gives us to be like the Good Samaritan can inspire us to step in and help out wherever needed. In what way? Well, that depends on the situation! You must think how and take your stand.

Getting back to L.A. Ring's painting - about one year after he painted his pregnant wife in the threshold to their lush garden, he paints her again in the same room. This time she is not pregnant anymore. She is of course a mother now, and she has in the painting stepped into the room and is now sitting at the breakfast table. She sits there in her light summer dress with slippers on her feet; liberated and relaxed. The interior is decorated in the artistic, folk art inspired kind, highly fashionable among Scandinavian artists at the time. We did see that in the earlier painting. We also see a few changes to the plants on the right side. The myrtle in the terracotta pot is moved a little more into the room, just as Sigrid herself. The myrtle is an old Danish symbol of nuptial innocence and purity. It does not seem to grow as well as before. It is almost completely overshadowed by another plant in a terracotta pot, a palm tree on a pedestal, and in between the two bigger plants, smaller plants are appearing and started growing in their own small pots (husband and children?). Is she now totally dominated by motherhood and her status

as a married woman? It seems so. However, a myrtle branch is hovering over her head now symbolising her purity and innocence. Another change in the setting of the room is the missing curtain. What has happened? Has something gone wrong? Or has something new been revealed as the curtain has been torn to pieces? It refers perhaps to what happened at the moment when Jesus died on the cross and the curtain to the holiest of holiest was torn to pieces, giving access for everyone to God and for God to leave his temple to be wherever people are gathered in his name. Whatever the reference, something has changed for sure in the Ring family. Of course, they have had small children. They have gone across the threshold to in parenthood into something completely new to them. But at the same time, everything is the same. They probably have same daily meals, the same beautiful interior and the same lush garden outside. Seemingly only small changes have occurred. But then at the same time, everything is changed. It seems as if they have undergone the same change as Christians go through in life. We, as Christians, are living in the same world as ever with the same demands of society and community. But then, when we begin seeing God's deeds in the world and hearing God's word to us through Jesus Christ, this makes everything new. It gives us new perspectives. It tears the curtain of indifference away from our eyes and changes everything to something new and better, something worth fighting for and praying for. We may, of course, like Sigrid in the painting not always be that active in the world, we may withdraw ourselves for awhile from the



world. But the world will never be indifferent to us. We will keep on suffering with the world. The pain of my neighbour will be mine too, even if I may need to focus on other things in life right now, such as raising children and praying for them more than anything else.

Sigrid in the painting has for sure drawn herself back from the threshold. She is at peace with her domestic bliss. But the way out is still there through the threshold. And the curtains that could have blocked the view to the outside are also gone. Sigrid is in her life right now more occupied with food (on the table), comfort (the slippers on her feet). She is probably also in her daily life occupied with the young child she has recently given birth to, though she right now seems to have a quiet moment. But there is one very central detail in the painting that reveals that she is still interested in the world around her. She is reading the newspaper! And not just any kind of newspaper, but a radical kind: an atheistic, anti-royal, left wing,

revolutionary paper, "Politiken"! At that time in Denmark, in the late 1890s there was an open parliamentary and political battle between left and right. The newspaper Sigrid is reading was the newspaper of the radical left in Denmark. This seemingly idyllic domestic scene was at the time in this way shocking and provoking in the conservative art scene of Copenhagen. But let that be for now.

For me, the point is that we, as Christians, cannot leave the world to itself, even if we feel that there is more to life than just politics, money, prestige and all those earthly things. Even in our relatively spiritual enlightened position, we must also keep oriented with the world in all its diversity. But more than that, we must take a stand and do our part to fight for a better society for all people. How? We all have our ideas and our situation in life to care for. But we must also be prepared to step out of our little space and in compassion with our fellow human beings pray and fight for the world we all share.

Right now, most of us are confined to ourselves. It seems that social distancing is here to stay for quite awhile. We can, however, keep ourselves oriented through the media. I, myself, feel much like in the situation of L.A. Ring's wife, Sigrid, drawn back from the world and real life. But thank God that the curtain between His realm and ours is torn to pieces, so we can see God, nevertheless. We may at times feel lonely, but we are never alone when we trust in God. We may at times also feel pacified and restricted, but we still have a responsibility in relation to our fellow human beings. I read and learn about all this from L.A. Ring's beautiful painting of his wife, just as I read and learn about all this in the word of God in the Bible.

A last note: L.A. Ring is known for being an atheist. However, I still feel a religious sensitivity in his paintings. As a true artist, he is in touch with a certain kind of spirituality and with a deep understanding of humankind. In his life, L.A. Ring often suffered from melancholia tending toward depression. I think it is difficult to see God active in the world and in His word, when you are depressed. L.A. Ring did not see a way out for humankind in our double-sided and often split situation. But as a Christian, I believe that there is release and forgiveness and salvation for all of us in Jesus Christ. I feel a profound optimism in the Christian faith that I wish all people on earth will experience. We are, of course, not always living

fully in God's reality. We are at times locked up in body or mind or spirit. We are at times suffering ourselves, pessimists or in sorrow. But this is not the entire story. We must always hold onto the belief that God always has new, wonderful surprises for us in this life or beyond.

At the time L.A. Ring painted his wife in 1898, he was veiled in the bliss of romantic love and happiness. His early years of marriage were his best in life and the lightest. This is reflected in his paintings from those years. I think our eyes can almost "drink" from these paintings, the light and happiness he experienced, but we can also learn, if we behold them with eyes enlightened by Jesus Christ, that there is a beyond that we must nourish in ourselves, as well as a world outside our doorstep that we must care for to the best of our abilities.

Can't wait to see you soon again, whenever you are ready. God bless you all, may you find hope and peace and blessings until we see each other again,
