March marks the anniversary of the pandemic here in Canada. This is for sure nothing to celebrate. However, it gives me a pretext to reflect upon what we may have learned from this extraordinarily difficult situation.

In the Newsletter for March-April last year, just before the pandemic struck our part of the world, I gave some thoughts on the time of Lent - on how we can use this season, that usually runs through March, to focus our thoughts and energy on what is important in life. I admitted that many of us have enough struggles in life and do not need more to abstain from and more troubles to deal with. For many people, life is like a long lent. Restrictions and abstinence are their "way of life". We need to help them with compassion and empathy more than anything else in this world. Those were my thoughts one year ago.

The last 12 months have given these thoughts a turn of the screw. This Lenten "way of life" of restrictions and abstinence has become the lifestyle of most of us. In many ways, we have been plunged into an involuntary Lent for almost a year. No one has been

unaffected by the pandemic in some way or another. But of course, the pandemic has mostly taken a toll on those who have been sick, those who have lost loved ones, those who have lost jobs and income and those who have been lonely and nervous. However, I feel that the awareness of this toll on the weak and needy has awakened our compassion and willingness to make sacrifices to the benefit of all people. Most of us feel for our neighbours, our own lonely family members, our friends, as well as for the many who are hit hard by the pandemic. It's more empathy than I have ever experienced before.

I believe that our ability to be kind and understanding is laid as a God-given seed in our hearts as we are created in his image. But sometimes, as with the seed in the ground, we need the right time and the right circumstances for this divine ability in us to sprout and grow and give fruit to ourselves as to the world. Perhaps, it has been easier for us to understand the sufferings in the world now, when we ourselves know the pain, the restrictions, and abstinences from our own life.



### A Message from the Board

Greetings everyone. We have passed the worst of the dark days of winter and spring is nearing. We hope you have been "attending" the on-line services through this lock down period during the pandemic and that Pastor Lasse's services have brought you comfort. The Candlemas Service was deeply moving and many of us placed a candle in our own windows that evening. It was a joy to hear the voices of him and his family as they helped celebrate the Light. Plus, the antics of Thaddeus are always charming.

Fastelavn has grown popular with our congregation over the past few years. It was a disappointment that we were not able to hold our celebration after Service this year. We love to see the costumes and enjoy our boller together as we watch the youngsters crack open the barrel and enjoy the sweets. However, we managed to have a virtual celebration viewable on our website. Hosanna in the Highest, Pastor Lasse's "right hand" and Ansgar's beloved donkey friend, was busy helping the children learn the Fastelavn song in the beginning of February so they could all sing together. Pastor Lasse has made numerous videos, especially for the children, on the website that feature Hosanna and teach important Christian lessons.

Thank you for your response in sending in your voting registration. If you haven't yet done so, please sign and mail in yours. The Annual Congregational Meeting, scheduled to be held February 28, 2021 may have to be postponed. The current Government restrictions in place do not allow us to gather in numbers as yet and the Board is considering our options. Our Bylaws say specifically that voting must be done in person and do not allow voting by proxy, yet we must consider safe-distancing and gathering restrictions and the ramifications of postponing the ACM. We are seeing some relaxing of restrictions at time of writing, so we are hopeful. Please check the Ansgar website and Facebook page for up-to-date information.

The Board has made some effort recently to encourage you to join a monthly giving plan. It is the most sensible way for us to budget and has been actively encouraged by many boards over many years. You can set up a transfer from your bank or call Bent, our Treasurer, to arrange an automatic charge to your credit card.

When this church was incorporated in 1930, it was subsidized by the Danish Church Abroad (then DKU, now DSUK). It was reasonable for the Danish immigrants to receive help. We are proud to say Ansgar Church has been fully self-supporting for decades. It would be unreasonable to expect anyone to subsidize us now. We are asking you to look inside your own heart and decide if Ansgar Church is part of your life. Does this Church hold meaning for you? Do you want to celebrate the Christian Holy days here, enjoy the fellowship here, and have this place mean something to your children? It is up to you to support Ansgar Church so it can support you. It requires a financial commitment on your part. You are wanted and welcome and cared for here. We want this Church – this place of belonging, acceptance, and love - to feel like home to you, to your children and to their children. We encourage you to make the commitment to support Ansgar Church now so it will be.




"Always together, Never apart,

And we have in this way all seen very clearly that we, as human beings, are not the masters of this world. ### IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

If you only feed your dog or cat once a year, what do you think will happen? Well, of course it will die! Our church finds itself in a similar situation. Many of our members only "feed" it once a year. Our church does not expect to get fed every day, however, once per month will keep the roof over our heads and the bills paid.

Currently we have only 22 of 300 members set up for an automatic charge to their credit cards for which we are extremely grateful. This is very easy to set up. All you have to do is give the treasurer a phone call and he will set you up. Once the transaction is set up, the document is destroyed and no record of your card number is kept. How much you ask does our church want from me? Currently, the members that are set up contribute an average of \$ 117.00 per month. Those donations range from \$10 and up. Our church does not expect any member to contribute more than they can afford. But it does need our members to donate what they can afford. So, here are some guidelines that can help you determine what amount you could contribute to help our church. If your annual income is:

- \$13,800: a yearly donation of \$120 will work out to \$10 per month
- \$27,600: a yearly donation of \$240 will work out to \$20 per month
- \$69,000: a yearly donation of \$600 will work out to \$50 per month
- \$100,000 a yearly donation of \$870.00 will work out to \$72.50 per month
- \$150,000: a yearly donation of \$1,305
   will work out to \$108.75 per month

All contributions qualify for an annual tax receipt to reduce your income taxes payable. As you can see from these samples, on a monthly basis the amounts are not huge. If all 300 of us members come on board, we will keep our church in a healthy state. Our goal is to raise a monthly amount of \$13,700 each and every month as this is what it costs to operate our church. We are counting on your support and appreciate any amount you can contribute.






The Holy week is the peak of the Church Year. A time we all look forward to every year.

### Immigrant Organizations, part 2

In the last issue we read about the history of IO's in general, how and why they come into existence and their function. We noted the challenges facing those organizations after several generations and included a bit of information about the Danish community's organizations. This issue is about Ansgar Church and its early history.

The Danes living in and around Edmonton in the 1920's desired to have Danish Lutheran Church Service. There was a Danish Pastor living in Calgary and they arranged to have him travel to Edmonton to do so. In the fall of 1923, the first Danish Lutheran service was held in the Norwegian Lutheran Church; the 100th anniversary of that first Service is approaching and will be honoured here at Ansgar Church. A Calgary pastor came to Edmonton approximately once per month when possible for the next few years. The venture was well-received and in May of 1928 the Danish Church Abroad (DKU) sent Pastor, Max Mathiessen to Edmonton. He rented the German Reformed Church on the corner of 96 St. and 108A Avenue in August of 1928 for \$75 a year.

The Ansgar Danish Lutheran Church of Edmonton was founded on January 30, 1930 when the first and founding Constitution was voted on and accepted by the 42 charter members. The Constitution stated that only a Danish evangelical Lutheran minister, selected by the congregation, and ordained in the Danish State Church could fill the position of Pastor. This Article exists in our Constitution to this day. The first Board meeting was held on March 26, 1930. The Ansgar Danish Lutheran Church of Edmonton was incorporated in the Province of Alberta, Canada on August 8, 1933.

At an extraordinary general meeting held on June 15, 1933, Ansgar Church decided to purchase the building and adjacent lot for \$4000. It was a mammoth undertaking for the tiny congregation living in very uncertain times. The members were given piggybanks to save their offerings. The church was

small and had no basement and on November 16, 1937 a proposal for a new building (in the familiar style of Danish Churches) prepared by Danish architect Holm Møller, was presented. An estimate of \$1167 to raise the building - with an unfinished basement - was presented on January 26, 1938 and the saving to the "Building Fund' continued in earnest. In August 1939, the German church building was sold and moved to a different location, and all able hands commenced to digging the basement and building the new church. The church as we know it was inaugurated on August 25, 1942.

The house on the adjacent lot owned by the Church was rented out whenever possible through this period. It was decided in May 1942 to repair the house and offer it as part of compensation to the pastor to save on wages. Pastor Bentsen agreed and in he and Mrs. Bentsen moved. The house came to be known as "the Parsonage" and is still commonly referred to by that name. The noble wood doors that to this day stand at the entrance of the church was donated by Pastor and Mrs. Bentsen in memory of their son.

The early period of Ansgar Church was difficult to say the least. The Great Depression had upended the world, times were difficult, and families struggled to survive. There were challenges to find the money to pay the mortgage and pay the pastor. World War II made it impossible to keep contact with Denmark and there were debates about whether to join the American Lutheran Synod or stay with DKU. Interestingly, the same questions plagued the early Church Boards that are still top of mind today: how to get people to attend church and how to pay the bills.

It's amazing when one considers the efforts of those Danes. There was a need and they were determined to succeed. Ansgar Danish Lutheran Church of Edmonton is the result.
